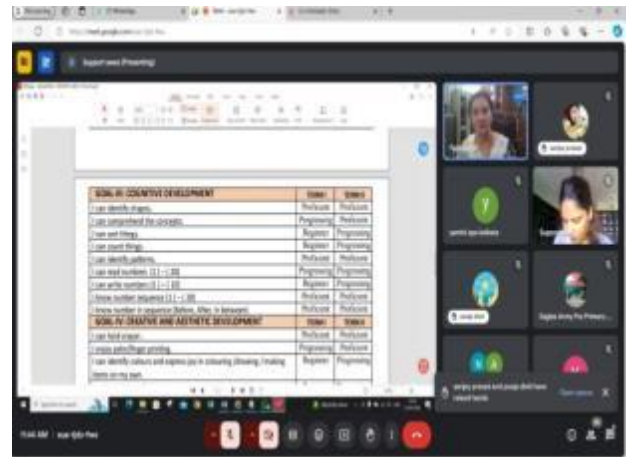
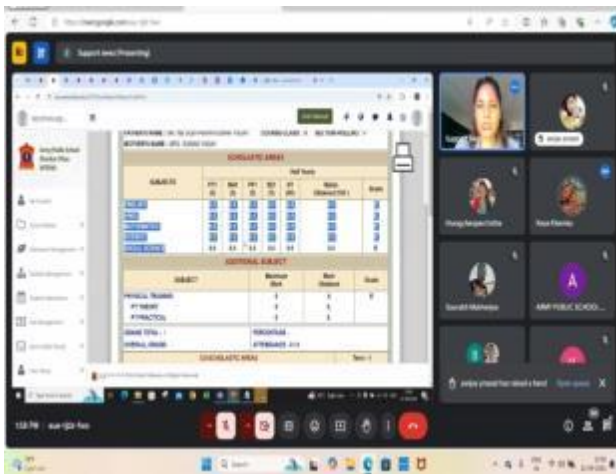

AN ONLINE SESSION ON 'TRG (PHASE III) ON DIGICAMPUS VER 2.0'

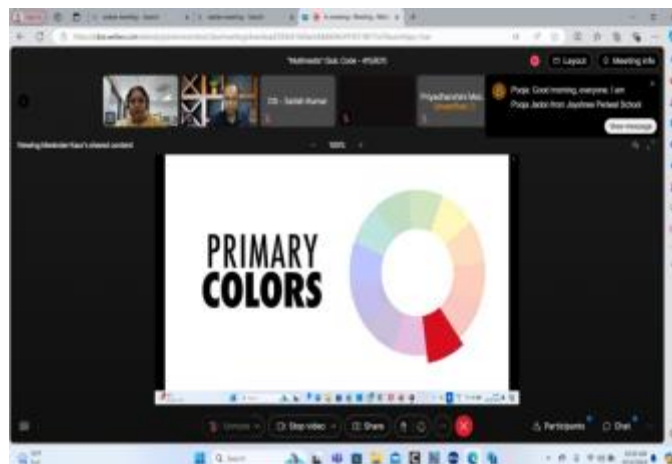

PROCUREMENT OF NEW BUS

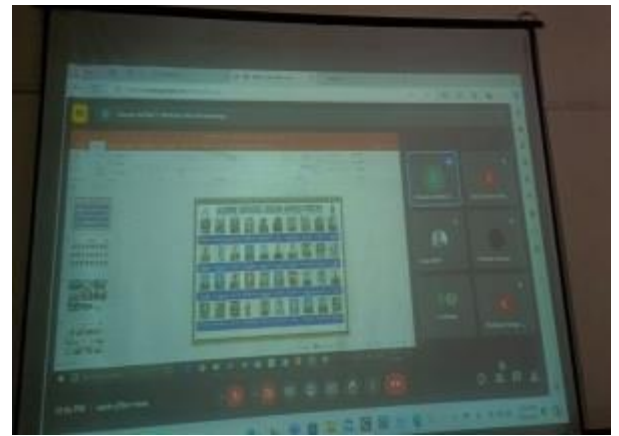

STAFF MEETING BY SCHOOL CHAIRMAN

A meeting was called to order by the Chairman, APS, Gwalior Brigadier Deepak Mann, Cdr 36 Arty Brigade on 25 September 24 at APS Gwalior. It was attended by Dr Arvind Kumar Sikarwar, Principal, APS, Gwalior, Mrs Vivian Singh, Vice Principal, Mrs Jayanti Naidu, Head Mistress, and all the teaching staff (I-XII). The meeting commenced with the opening remarks by the Chairman, APS, Gwalior. The agenda focused on reviewing academic performance and discussing future strategies for improvement. Mrs Jayanti Naidu, HM, APS Gwalior and Mrs Vivian Singh, Vice Principal, APS Gwalior gave their presentations. Mrs Jayanti Naidu, HM, gave a presentation on the performance of Pre-Primary and Primary Classes. She showed students performance data of Evaluation 1/PT-I for classes III –V. She apprised everyone of the utility of zero period for the holistic development of the students, inculcating empathy, respect and collaborative skills among the students. She talked about the language and literacy development, phonics and cognitive development of the students. She also suggested to have class library in primary classes. The Chairman gave his remarks by reiterating the need to show more efforts to improve the results of certain classes and appreciated the idea of class library. He also focused on the need to teach mobile hygiene, mobile discipline, financial literacy and research skills among the students.

The next presentation was given by Mrs Vivian Singh, Vice Principal. She showed the API of classes VI-XII in the first evaluation/PT-I. She discussed the utility of zero period in senior classes for the reinforcement of difficult topics. She provided the parents' feedback points received during PTM. She apprised the Chairman about the efforts to improve communication skills of the students. She suggested the need of Library Projects required to enhance the communication skills of the students. She talked about the measures adopted by the school admin and teaching staff for the safety and security of the students. She discussed the ways by which the monitoring of teaching staff was being done by the administrative authorities.
